Our study will include scales (how they work, numbering of notes, etc.), chords (what they are, how to find them, numbering systems, etc.), and how to read guitar tab. This essential foundation will allow you to understand the "why" behind the "what" in playing the guitar. As time allows, we will cover topics such as strumming, bass runs, and simple practice techniques.
